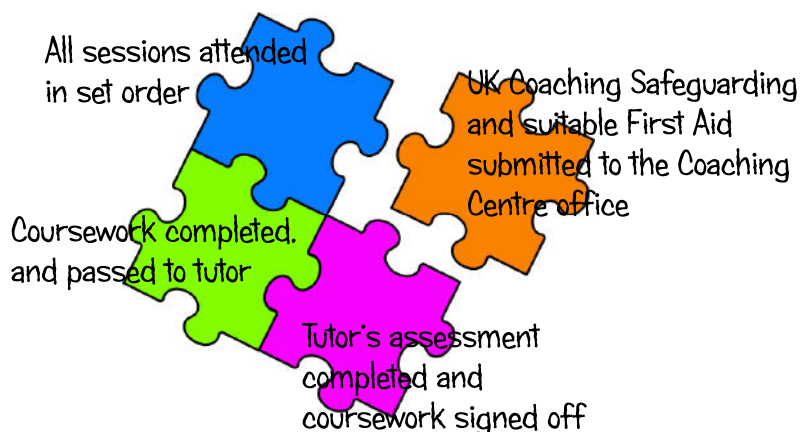


Level 2 Certificate in Coaching: getting qualified and licensed

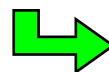
What are the requirements for being awarded a certificate?

- ▶ You must have completed the attendance/online sessions, coursework and assessments.
- ▶ Before Angling Trust can apply to 1st4sport for your qualification certificate, you must also have undertaken training for both **appropriate First Aid** and **UK Coaching Safeguarding & Protecting Children training**, and you'll need to supply evidence of both of these to the Coaching Centre Administrator. Angling Trust has identified certain online training courses which can be accepted for certification and licensing — guidance about these is available separately.

You can provide that evidence (normally digital images of the certificates) before, during or even after the scheduled dates of your selected Level 2 course. The confirmation of your course booking and also your pre-course mailing should have included information about identifying suitable First Aid and Safeguarding workshops, and Coaching Centre admin can supply further copies if you can't now locate those.



1st4sport sends your certificate to Angling Trust, and we'll forward it to you as quickly as possible.



....and when you've qualified, we hope you'll also want to become a **licensed coach**. The **Licensed Coach Scheme** offers you specialised insurance for your coaching activities, and you're eligible to get the first year free of charge.

We now contact you by email about arranging DBS checking and coach licensing after your certification has been applied for. If you already hold a current Level 1 licence, converting that to Level 2 is quick and simple.

What about DBS checking? Do I need that as well to get my qualification?

Safeguarding training isn't the same thing as a DBS check. You **don't** need DBS checking in order to take or pass a coaching course, but if you want to become licensed, you'll probably need to arrange a check through Angling Trust.
