Partnerships are powerful! That's why in 2020-2021 we joined forces with over 1,200 like-minded groups and organisations. With fishing licence income, we were able to support and collaborate with partners such as local river trusts, angling clubs, charities and many more.


Through contributions we made to partners, fishing licence income helped:

- ✓ Launch the Get Fishing Fund, investing £200k to help angling clubs and fisheries restart participation events after lockdown.
- ✓ Nearly 4,000 invertebrate surveys take place and ensure a response to 197 trigger level alerts, indicating a possible pollution impact, giving greater understanding about the health of our rivers.
- ✓ Fund projects to the tune of £1.5m to improve fish stocks, and habitat.



IMPROVEMENT WORKS

Some of your licence income is invested into supporting projects that enhance habitat for fish. Improving habitat means better angling opportunities and resilient fisheries.

In 2020-2021 we directly funded over 200 projects on 575km of river and 153 hectares of still waters.

### These projects included:


- √ 172 Fisheries Improvement projects

- √ 45 fish passes constructed or barriers to fish removed






Enhancing fisheries provides greater opportunities for spawning, feeding and avoiding predators or weather extremes like flood and drought. It doesn't just make ecological sense, it makes good fishing sense!

COARSE FISH STOCKING



Rearing and releasing fish doesn't just ensure your angling experience is enjoyable, it also helps replenish stocks following an environmental incident, or kickstart recovery from longer term issues like pollution.






In 2020-2021 we stocked 489,165 fish into rivers and stillwaters across the country for the benefit of anglers.


## Fishing licence income funds a world-class fisheries laboratory



With your licence fee, we are able to ensure that fish are healthier and better protected, both today and in the future.

### Our diagnostic investigations helped to:

- ✓ Detect the novel parasite, Argulus mongolianus
- Co-ordinate national reports of Red Skin Disease in wild Atlantic salmon
- ✓ Advised on the regulatory control of Carp Edema Virus (CEV) in carp fisheries



We work with the Angling Trusts Voluntary Bailiff Scheme (with 500 volunteers), police forces and other enforcement agencies to protect fisheries and prevent illegal fishing. Between 2020-2021 we checked 17,106 fishing licences and volunteer bailiffs carried out 11,604 patrols on our fisheries, resulting in more than 500 reports of incidents to ourselves or the police. Licence checks were significantly lower due to Covid – in 2019-2020 we checked over 61,000.





#### MONITORING



We carry out extensive, regular fish stock surveys and water quality monitoring on the rivers and stillwaters of greatest fishing interest or most at risk. Due to Covid, we carried out fewer surveys than the previous year - 119 compared to 1,521 in 2019-2021.

However, thanks to your fishing licence, monitoring helps to provide a wider indicator of the local environment. It's another way that your fishing licence directly supports fisheries both today and in the future.
