ROLE OVERVIEW

The Angling Trust is seeking motivated, experienced and professional **Coach Assessors** to deliver high quality practical assessment days for learners completing the new Angling Trust coaching qualification. Coach Assessors play a vital role in ensuring that aspiring coaches demonstrate the skills, behaviours and knowledge required to coach safely, effectively and confidently within all angling environments.

Working independently and representing the Angling Trust to the highest standard, you will assess learners against national coaching standards, provide clear developmental feedback, and ensure a positive and supportive assessment experience. This role is ideal for experienced angling coaches who are passionate about developing others and contributing to a high-quality national coaching workforce.

Coach Assessors will be expected to have access to a suitable venue / location where participants can demonstrate their coaching skills and be assessed. The venue / location will need to be appropriate for the type of angling being assessed and may be a private, commercial or free to access venue. Consent of the venue owner will be required to be sought by the Coach Assessor. If there is a charge for access, attending participants will be required to purchase a 'day ticket'.

This is a flexible, part-time, self-employed role, with assessments delivered nationwide at approved venues.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- **Deliver practical assessment days** for learners completing the Angling Trust coaching qualification.
- **Assess learners against national coaching criteria**, ensuring consistency, fairness and adherence to Angling Trust standards.
- **Provide clear, developmental feedback** to learners to support their continued coaching journey.



ROLE DESCRIPTION | COACH ASSESSOR - COACHING

- **Ensure assessment days run safely and professionally**, including risk management, venue suitability checks and effective session administration.
- **Complete all required assessment documentation** accurately, promptly and in line with Angling Trust quality assurance processes.
- **Support the maintenance of high coaching standards** by modelling best practice and upholding professional behaviours at all times.
- **Communicate effectively** with the coaching team regarding assessment planning, learner progress, course availability and any concerns.
- **Contribute to ongoing improvements** in coaching assessment through reflective practice and engagement with standardisation activities.
- **Act as an ambassador** for the Angling Trust, promoting inclusive, safe and enjoyable participation in all angling disciplines.

As a Coach Assessor, you will:

- Help create a **skilled, confident and diverse coaching workforce** across England.
- Play a key role in the **successful delivery of the new Angling Trust coaching qualification**.
- Support learners at a crucial stage of their coaching journey, ensuring they have the competence and confidence to coach independently.
- Strengthen regional coaching capacity by delivering high quality, accessible assessment opportunities.

- Ability to work independently and manage assessment days effectively.
- Commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion within angling.
- Previous experience in assessing or delivering training programs.

- Knowledge of the Angling Trust coaching framework and pathways.



ROLE DESCRIPTION | COACH ASSESSOR - COACHING

• WORKING ARRANGEMENTS

- This is a **self-employed, flexible role**, with assessments scheduled based on availability and learner demand.
- Assessment delivery will take place at **approved angling venues** nationwide.
- Occasional online or in-person standardisation or development sessions may form part of the quality assurance process.
- This is a contracted role and you will be required to sign a contract and agree to the terms.
- You will be responsible for your own tax, national insurance, pension, insurance, and compliance obligations.
- You must remain as a licensed Angling Trust coach during the term of the contract keeping all additional accreditations (eg DBS checks and first aid certificates up to date).
- You will receive an Angling Trust email to assist you in undertaking the role.
